Hi, I am Jenny Holloway and just to explain my background I was a buyer for Littlewoods, a Selector for M&S and a senior buyer for Principles for Women. I then had my own label Retro for 10 years before being the manager of London Fashion Forum the original company that set up www.fashioncapital.co.uk.

The advice you need really is far more indepth than a statement on the website and that's why we set up www.fashion-enter.com. If you check this out you will see the type of support we offer. FashionCapital is really a generic portal site that signposting of help and aid whereas Fashion Enter is for serious designers to get to grips with their company. There is a membership fee but this also includes the opportunity to sell your garments in the boutique Enter at Croydon. Plus there is a wholesale division too that is called "Representing..." and a Japanese buyer has already placed 32 orders.

I would be more than happy to meet up with you and go through this query properly however the short answer to your question is yes there are machinists out there that can help you but they are like gold dust. There are organisations such as the London Apparel Resource Centre that also has a sample making facility. Their number is 020 8802 5555 when you get through ask to be put through to the sample room and then arrange a visit to see them all.
